LPL IN THE COMMUNITY - THE LPL2GO TECH VAN






The LPL2Go Tech Van allows us to bring WiFi, printing, hotspots, laptops and tech-based activities, along with books and other library services, right to our community. So far, the LPL2Go Van has visited many locations throughout the Liverpool community, including local food pantries, schools, parks, restaurants, cafes and more.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS FOR ALL

The LPL offers a full complement of early literacy programs, and this year was no exception. For 2022, over 300 children signed up for 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten, a program that encourages children and parents to read together. We also expanded our diverse and inclusive programming, with programs such as Sensory Story Time, Toddler Toy Time and Spanish Story Hour.



The LPL is proud of the strong relationship we have with the homeschooling community, and our programming continues to reflect this. At the start of the 2022 school year, we offered a back to school program for our homeschool students and families. The program was an immense success, as students were given the chance to have their school photo taken for the first time, interact with other homeschool children, share new ideas, and more.

We're proud to offer a variety of programming that is focused on the interests of our community. From community nights to art classes and lectures, we strive to adapt to the latest trends and offer programs tailored to our community.













NEW INITIATIVES



With funding from the NYS Assembly and Assemblywoman Pam Hunter, the LPL acquired a Charlie Cart- a self-contained mobile teaching kitchen. With the Charlie Cart, the LPL will be able to offer programs focused on food literacy and education, while also celebrating our diversity through food.

To further our commitment to accessibility, we installed hearing loops at the Information @ LPL Desk, the Children's Room desk, the Carman Community Room and Sargent Room. The loops allow our patrons with hearing devices to better enjoy and participate in library services and programs.
